The National Conference on Undergraduate Research (NCUR), established in 1987, is dedicated to promoting undergraduate research, scholarship, and creative activity in all fields of study by sponsoring an annual conference for students. Through this annual conference, NCUR creates a unique environment for the celebration and promotion of undergraduate student achievement, provides models of exemplary research and scholarship, and helps to improve the state of undergraduate education. NCUR 2022 will include the option of presentation competitions, which requires an earlier application process.

WESTMINSTER COLLEGE NCUR APPLICATION TIMELINE 2021/2022:

EARLY BIRD PROCESS (includes ability to be entered for presentation competitions)

October 15th 2021: Early Bird Deadline for student to submit Funding Application Form to Drinko Center.

October 18th 2021: Notification of Early Bird Application Funding Awards from the Drinko Center.

October 20th 2021: NCUR's Early Bird Abstract Submission and Competition Opt-In Deadline.

Week of November 15th 2021: NCUR Releases Decisions on Early Bird Abstract Acceptances.

December 20th 2021: Deadline for Early Bird Conference Registration: Coordinate with Drinko Center.

REGULAR PROCESS

November 5th 2021: Final Deadline for student to submit Funding Application Form to Drinko Center.

November 8th 2021: Notification of Funding Awards from the Drinko Center.

November 19th 2021: NCUR's Final Abstract Submission Deadline.

Week of January 10th 2021: NCUR Releases Decisions on Abstract Acceptances.

January 31st 2022: Deadline for Conference Registration: Coordinate with Drinko Center.

PART 1: Guidelines

Eligibility and Conditions

The student must be enrolled as a degree-seeking student at Westminster College at the time of the conference and be in good academic standing.

The student must make a presentation at NCUR and participate in aspects of the virtual event beyond their individual presentation.

Projects must be conducted under the mentorship of Westminster College faculty.

To receive NCUR funding, a completed NCUR Travel Grant Application must be submitted following the deadlines delineated above.

Award recipients are required to participate in the Undergraduate Research & Arts Celebration in the year of their grant.

Students who fail to participate in NCUR or URAC will be responsible for paying back their grant to the college in full.
